National Conservation & Leadership Summit

New Strategic Plan will be unveiled at the first summit since 1999

In the summer of 2007 the Order of the Arrow will hold a National Conservation and Leadership Summit at Indiana University.

It will be held July 28–Aug. 1, 2007.

The conference committee expects about 2,500 lodge leaders to attend this event.

At the summit, key lodge officers will be invited to attend and be updated on what the OA has planned for the next five years as a part of its National Strategic Plan.

The intent is for lodge leaders to take the information that they have learned back to their home lodges and implement the knowledge.

The OA’s next Strategic Plan will be revealed next year and will be used from 2008-2012 to direct the vision and path of the Order. This will be the third Strategic Plan introduced by the national committee.

The last National Summit was held in 1999 at Colorado State University. The people who attend will be split into two groups.

“While one group works on developing the strategic plan, another group will work on preparing the staff for ArrowCorps5,” said Mike Hoffman, Vice Chairman of National Events for the National OA Committee.

Opportunities range from working on communications such as the newspa-

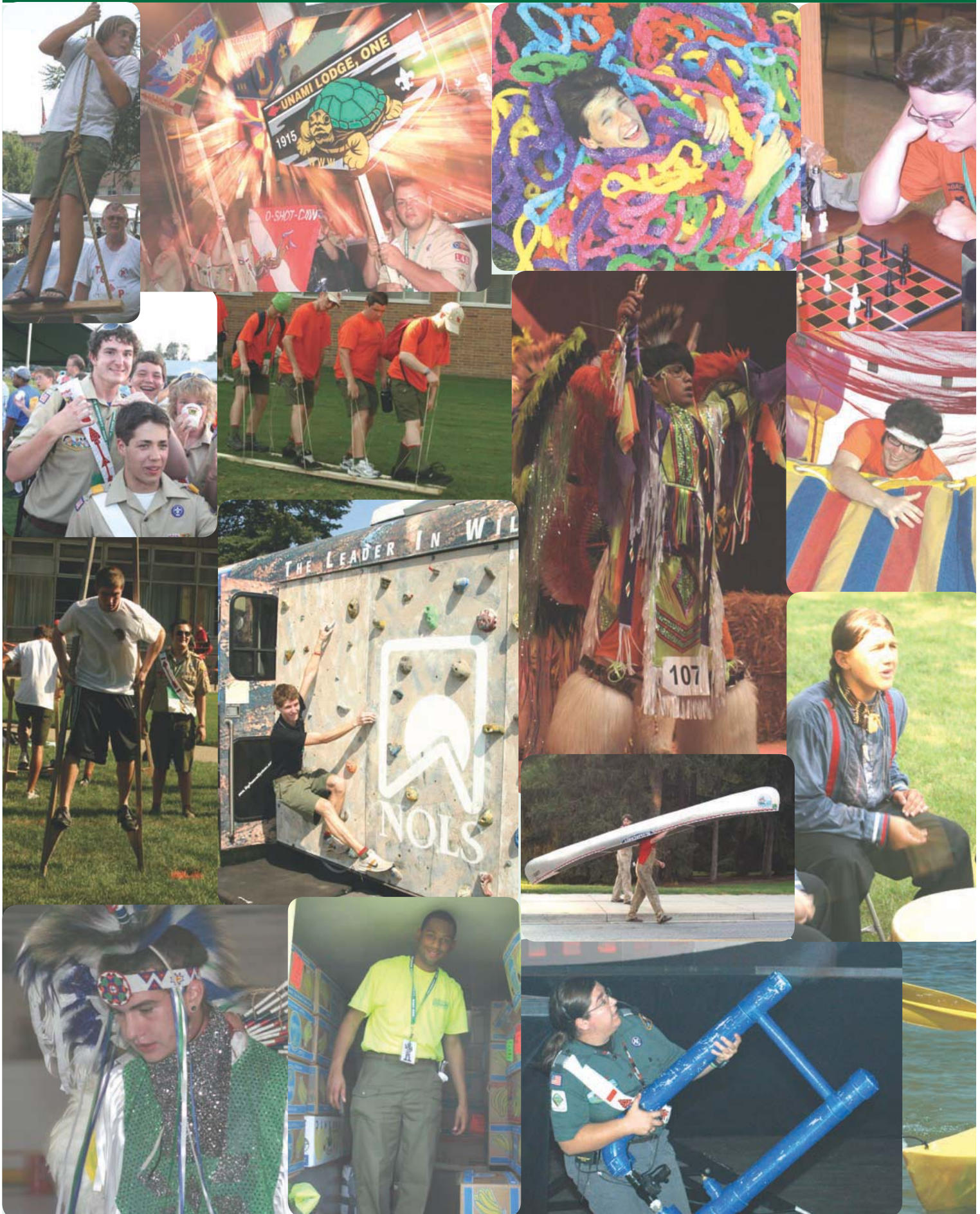
per or the website, to working with the Activities and Recreation Committee on the Grand Hodag.
